
#### Introduction:

The purpose of this project was to promote Trenton as a Trail Town, identify the assets of the City of Trenton and provide recommendations that would enhance their connectivity to the downtown area of the city.

#### Methods:

The team used a variety of primary and secondary data as a basis for their recommendations. They also incorporated input from a variety of community stakeholders from the Trenton Rotary Club, property owners, and the Trenton Trail Town Advisory Committee.

#### Socioeconomic:

The average age of the Trenton population in 2019 was about 47.5, (15% -20% higher than the Michigan average). More than 46% of the population in Trenton is over 50 years

The median household income in the Trenton area has a small increase every year reaching \$64.2K in 2018, higher than the median household income in Michigan/US during the same period.

Retail and Businesses: Manufacturing and medical care industries are the largest industries in Trenton and accounted for 15.9% and 15.4% of Trenton's local industry.

#### Trail Town:

Runs along Detroit River and connects to DRIWR and Elizabeth Park via roadways and non-motorized pathways.


Downriver Linked Greenways Trail and Iron Belle Trail Extension

Detroit River International Wildlife Refuge: Natural area along the Detroit River with walking trails. Aimed to be a catalyst for economic activity.




View from Detroit River International Wildlife Refuge

Elizabeth Park: The oldest park in Wayne County. Connects to the Downtown Area of Trenton and provides a location supporting outdoor recreation.







Trails: There are three main trails that connect to Trenton: a portion of the Downriver Linked Greenway Trail System, the Iron Belle Trail and the Detroit Heritage River Water Trail.

### Downtown Non-Motorized Travel

- Revisit Healthy Trenton Bicycle Rack Initiative
- Add bike fix-it station, bike rental station and protected bike lanes

# Downtown Walkability

- Fix sidewalk conditions
- Add more benches, a pergola Dog Park
- Establish a dog park in Elizabeth Park Downtown Businesses
- Fill vacant buildings
- Create Trail Town merchandise
- Food trucks

- Add electric scooters, trail signs, a trail kiosk
- Naming trail competition
