So, many activities relating to community service or making the world a better place should be included in your application.

Your Outstanding 4-H Member application needs to include the following:

- Completed Outstanding 4-H Member Cover Sheet
- Cover letter
- Your Resume
- Your 4-H Story (minimum 500 words, no more than 2 pages)

View this application as developing skills you will use when applying for a job, college or scholarships in the future. Neatness, spelling and grammar will contribute to your overall score. Good luck and have fun!

Completed applications are due to the Van Buren County MSU Extension office on or before the first Friday in August.

I understand that if I am selected as Outstanding 4-H member, I will be requested to participate in activities at the Van Buren Youth Fair each evening and I will be required to participate in 4-H events throughout the year.

A sample schedule of duties may include, but not limited to with variance in schedule:

October: Promote National 4-H week to others

November: Talk to State Representatives, legislature or government or attend a local township

meeting

December: Participation in a holiday parade representing 4-H January: Attending a service organization meeting to promote 4-H

February: Attend a 4-H club meeting, not their own

March: Attend a County Board of Commissioners meeting April: Be interviewed on a radio show to promote 4-H

May: Submit a letter to the editor or write an article in a local newspaper promoting 4-H*

June: Attend a county committee meeting (4-H Leaders' Association, LLC, Horse Council, SMAC)

July: Perform duties during the Van Buren Youth Fair

August: Submit a letter to the editor or write an article in a local newspaper promoting 4-H*

September: Assist at the Van Buren County 4-H Leaders and Youth Awards

Your 4-H Story

Your 4-H Story is a very important part of your application. Try to convey how your participation in 4-H contributed to your self-respect and concern for others, how it has influenced you in school, in your use of leisure time and in your career plans. Your 4-H Story is the place to expand on facts and figures by telling what your experiences have meant to you; how they have developed and affected your confidence, your attitude and other factors. Your 4-H Story adds warmth and depth to your application packet. It should not be a relisting of what you included in your resume.

The following outline may help you develop Your 4-H Story. It is divided into parts simply to help you outline what you want to say about yourself. Do not identify these parts in Your 4-H Story.

Part 1

Introduce yourself. Include information about your age, interests, family, where you live, where you go to school, when and why you became involved in 4-H.

Part 2 = 10 points

Highlight your 4-H projects and activities, including major learning experiences, special interests and unusual situations you have encountered.

Part 3 = 15 points

Explain how 4-H has helped you become a better leader and citizen, how 4-H has increased your interest and participation in community affairs, and what you have learned from your team or group involvement and efforts.

Part 4 = 15 points

Describe how 4-H participation has helped you to feel good about yourself, influenced your school and career goals and your use of leisure time. Tell about your future plans and the career you want to pursue.
