Leaders of each club and any new or interested families are invited to attend. Sending a club representative to one of these meetings is the best way to know if you are up to date with any new information and Youth Show changes.

2019 Camping Changes

In an effort to continuously improve the 4-H Youth Show camping process, the following changes will be implemented this year:

- The limited 30 amp sites will be charged a premium of \$100 (in addition to the \$90 standard electric hook-up camping fee)
- 30 amp sites will be assigned first to superintendents (if requested) and the remaining 30 amp site assignments will be based on a lottery.

If you opt to be included in the lottery and are selected for a 30 amp site, the additional premium must be paid within 5 business days or the premium site is forfeited. Camping registration will be open from May 1 – June 25 and space will continue to be assigned on a first come-first served basis until capacity is reached. Early forms will not be accepted and any forms received in the mail will be numbered at the end of each day.

Livestock Weigh-In and Tagging Dates

Lamb. goat. and feeder calf weigh in and **swine** tagging will be **May 4**th. Tagging will be held at the Farm Council Grounds and will go from 8:00 – 11:00 AM. Here are a few reminders about weigh-in/tagging rules:

- ALL cattle must have an RFID tag in their ear at weigh-in and at the Youth Show
- Animals MUST be tagged in at the spring weigh-in in order to be shown at the Youth Show.
- Exhibitors are allowed to tag in up to 4 animals, but can only exhibit 2 at the Youth Show
- All males must be castrated before tagging
- All sheep and goats must have a Scrapies tag or tattoo at weigh-in and at the Youth Show
- Lambs cannot exceed **<u>110</u>** pounds at the spring weigh-in
- All market hogs must be tagged at the spring weigh-in, but they will NOT be weighed. Hogs are not allowed to leave the trailer

Small Animal Committee
