

Kramer All Around Versatility Award.

The Horse Board of Washtenaw County 4-H created The Kramer All-Around Versatility Award to recognize the horse and rider team that best demonstrated the skills and talents for which Kramer and his riders were recognized. For to truly excel, a talented horse needs an exceptional partner.

This award will be given as a high point championship annually to the horse and rider team which exhibits those skills and talents in the six classes in which Kramer and those that rode him excelled: Showmanship, Hunt Seat Equitation, Stock Seat Horsemanship, English and Western Pleasure, and Trail.

The award this year will be presented by Mary (Field) Soules and Madeline Soules: the young lady who coaxed him back into the ring. and last year's winner, Taylor Schrock.

And, since he is still hanging out here at fairgrounds, Kramer himself. (If award is given on Friday. If on Saturday omit.)

Kramer All-Around Versatility Award.

This award is a high point award. There is a traveling trophy as well as a Silver Buckle (provided by sponsor of the award: The Field Family.)

Criteria:

1. Eligible riders: 3rd year and advanced riders in the senior division.
2. Must show in all six classes to be considered for the award. (Showmanship, Trail, English Pleasure, English Equitation, Stock Seat Pleasure and Stock Sheet Horsemanship)
3. Tie –Breakers – 1. Rider with the highest Trail score 2. Highest placing in Showmanship.
