Martech/Blue Ribbon registration is OPEN for the 2019 Washtenaw 4-H Youth Show! Registration is open until 11:50 pm on Monday, June 24. Paperwork is due from clubs to the office by close of business, Tuesday June 25. Check with your Administrative 4-H Club leader for any earlier club deadlines!

Additional information is available at the website as described above. Here are some 4-HYS Pre-registration Hot tips:

- You can use the same login and password as past years, but you will create a new account to do so.
- When creating accounts for multiple youth, you can use the same email each time, but do need a new login and password for each youth. Make it something you can remember, and write it down because we cannot retrieve your information.
- Only create one account per youth, and add multiple 4-H clubs under that youth name. (Duplicates make the program a mess AND cost an extra \$2.)
- Clubs register using the club name, leader address, and **any** age over 21 ☺ (Ages are displayed on the project tags, so you decide...)
- Once you set up your account, save when you can and consider that you don't have to submit registration right away. Simply Logout until you are sure you are all set with additions or changes closer to the end of registration. If you happen to forget to go back and checkout, we will submit it for you when registration closes. This way you can still make changes!

Make sure you are enrolled as a 4-H member at <https://mi.4honline.com> by **June 1!** Once you have your classes entered online in Martech/Blue Ribbon, communicate with your club leader about:

- How many pens you need for your various animal projects
- Let them know any project display space needed for your registered projects
- Payment to the club/leader for registration fees (Only \$2 per each youth aged 5-19 who registered at link above)
- Volunteer with your leader for any Setup, Clerk, Runner, 4-H Service Club Food Booth, Fri BBQ, Buyers Buffet, Building A Guards, Herdsmanship Judging, Office help, Auction Clerk, Clean-up, Overnight Stay, etc., that you are available for during the 4-H Youth Show week.

We look forward to getting everyone registered, and hope you will let us know if you find errors in the system, or have any questions!

Most U.S. students in grade 5-8 do not study chemistry as a separate subject. Participating in a Challenge offers a critical exposure to this content. Students compete individually by answering multiple choice questions in a bee-style competition, starting with a regional challenge in their community. Students can advance to a State Challenge, and ultimately to the National Challenge. **Anita Gaenko**, a seventh grader from Clague Middle School, Ann Arbor won the **third place** in State of Michigan Championship. **Amitha Ravikanth**, a seventh grader from Slauson Middle School, made it to the intermediate round in the state of Michigan Championship challenge. Archery Program Resuming in Spring

The Washtenaw County 4-H Target Archery Club will resume on Tuesday evenings starting April 23rd thru May 28th (2 week break) then resumes June 18th thru July 16th at the Washtenaw Farm Council Grounds from 6-8 p.m. Youth 7 years old to 19 years old are welcome. Calling all Washtenaw County 4-H Teens!

Are you interested in traveling to another state? Meeting new people? Seeing different parts of the country? Having an amazing time?

The **Washtenaw County 4-H Exchange Group** may be for you!

Who? Youth 13 & up (in 4-H years, as of 1/1/20) are encouraged to join.

What? The Exchange Group is a two-year commitment. We usually travel the first summer and host the following. The group for the 2020-2021 rotation is forming now.

When? We generally host/travel the last week of June for six to eight days.

Where? Depends on what state we choose!

How? Almost all the money we need is raised by working a concession stand at both U-M Football and Men's Basketball home games. We have also scooped ice cream at the Chelsea Fair. Participation will commence in August, 2019.

Washtenaw County resurrected the exchange program in 2012. Since then, we have traveled to and hosted youth from Texas, Kansas, Oregon and, most recently, Colorado.

When we host, what we do varies some but typically we take a tour bus to Mackinac Island and take a carriage tour, see Arch Rock, the Butterfly House, Fort Mackinac and spend some time exploring on our

own. From there, we travel over to Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore where we climb some and take a driving tour. We ride a dune buggy at Silver Lake along beautiful Lake Michigan. We spend two nights "up north." We also take a bus and spend a day at Cedar Point, the Roller Coaster Capital of the World. We go to The Henry Ford and tour the Ford Rouge Plant, where the F-150s are made and have the option of visiting both Greenfield Village and The Henry Ford Museum. We have two family dinner nights and have a local day when we might do things like: pick blueberries at Kapnick Orchard, tour the Jiffy Mix factory, tour a sawmill, get ice cream, play miniature golf, go canoeing on the Huron River, or tour Horning's dairy farm.

2019 Camping Changes

In an effort to continuously improve the 4-H Youth Show camping process, the following changes will be implemented this year:

- The limited 30 amp sites will be charged a premium of \$100 (in addition to the \$90 standard electric hook-up camping fee)
- 30 amp sites will be assigned first to superintendents (if requested) and the remaining 30 amp site assignments will be based on a lottery.

If you opt to be included in the lottery and are selected for a 30 amp site, the additional premium must be paid within 5 business days or the premium site is forfeited. Camping registration will be open from May 1 – June 25 and space will continue to be assigned on a first come-first served basis until capacity is reached. Early forms will not be accepted and any forms received in the mail will be numbered at the end of each day.

Michigan 4-H Foundation opens 2019-20 grant cycle

Awarded annually, the Michigan 4-H Foundation recently opened their grant and award opportunities for the 2019-2020 season. Open to 4-H volunteer leaders, members and staff, the grants and awards support local

4-H clubs and county programs, as well as recognize members of the 4-H community. All applications are due June 1.

Opportunities include:

- **Michigan 4-H Legacy Grants of \$1,000.** These grants are awarded to support development of a new program or initiative, or to strengthen, enhance or expand a current program that's making a difference.
- **4-H On-Target Grants of \$500.** These grants support 4-H Shooting Sports programs to enhance existing programs, develop a new program, or offer a special experience related to 4-H Shooting Sports.
- **The Collins 4-H Youth Horticulture Grant of \$350.** This grant is available only to 4-H youth clubs and supports advancement of club work in plant science and horticulture activities.
- **4-H Educational Garden Grants of \$1,000.** These grants support the creation of local 4-H educational

gardens in Michigan.

- **Michigan Farm Bureau 4-H Excellence in Agriculture Award (includes \$1,000 grant).** This award recognizes the outstanding achievements of 4-H agricultural volunteers.
