Teen Travels to Washington DC to Discuss Teen Mental Health

Several Washtenaw County 4-H teens have been working with Microsoft and National 4-H on a national grant to identify ways they can use technology to address local issues. Last October two teens from Chelsea traveled to Microsoft HQ to finalize their plans and identified Teen Mental Health as the issue they wanted to tackle. This fall, as part of that project, another Chelsea teen, Artie Keaton, was invited to attend a conference in Washington DC hosted by the Adolescent Peer Support League. This conference provided information about school mental health resources and a teen perspective on related issues. The above Washtenaw County 4-H teens also nominated their High School for an award during the conference, and so Chelsea High School was the recipient of the Silver Award for Peer Support out of all attendees. Thanks to Artie for being willing to attend, and receive this award. We hope you will continue to use your teen voice to share everything you learned with your school and community so that 4-H can continue to help "move the needle" in support of positive teen mental health.
