Happy fall, ya'll! It is now time to visit <u>www.4honline.com</u> to re-enroll for Washtenaw County 4-H. You must use the same email address as in the past, and your password should also still work. If you forgot your password, just choose the "forgot password" option and reset it. We do not know individual family passwords, but we can look up a club password or change club administrator status if leadership changes. Once enrolled, give \$20 to your club leader as soon as possible (Checks written to MSU). It is handy to have your health/insurance information handy when you begin to register at 4honline. We encourage re-enrollments to be done ASAP, and not wait until later in the 4-H year. Any trouble with re-enrollment, contact Kellie at 222-3815 or jordankj@msu.edu. Please plan to re-enroll by November 1 to make sure your 4-H membership is not interrupted, and your club is in good standing.

As we begin a new 4-H year, please, please, please explore some of the statewide 4-H events. These opportunities will expand your teen horizons in unimaginable ways, and could connect interested teens with specialists on campus and across the country. 4-H Member of the Month: Bailey Welshans

Bailey Welshans is 18 years old and is a member of Saline 4-H Farmers. Bailey has been involved in 4-H for 12 years! Over the years Bailey has shown beef cattle, rabbits, and poultry. Bailey has been an active member in the Michigan 4-H State Youth Leadership Council (SYLC) and has done many leadership and community service projects with them. Bailey took the initiative to collaborate with Tractor Supply in Ann Arbor and Whitmore Lake to set up a 4-H informational table durning Clover Days to inform folks about 4-H and all that it has to offer. In addition to SYLC, Bailey has been very involved with the Washtenaw 4-H Livestock Judging Team. Bailey has grown exponentially over the past year through her judging and reasons. Bailey competed at various contests this past summer and placed in the top 20 at the Michigan 4-H Livestock Judging Contest. Being on the 4-H State Youth leadership council, I've gained leadership, communication and people skills that have helped me and will help me in the future.

The most memorable thing is getting to experience life with youth, no matter where I am because of 4H. I was fortunate enough to go on the Citizenship Washington Focus trip in the Summer of 2017 where I got to meet youth from all over the U.S. and share our thoughts, opinions, and concerns about the things going on in our world. AA4STEM Club Competes at You Be the Chemist Contest

AA4STEM 4H club youth members Dhivya Balasubramanian, Anjalika Dandamundi, Ashmit Deb, Anita Gaenko, Anirudh Venkat, and Varsha Pothappu, sixth and seventh-grade students, participated in the You Be the Chemist Challenge regional competition. This is an academic competition for students in grade 5-8, where the excitement and value of chemistry take center stage! Most U.S. students in grade 5-8 do not study chemistry as a separate subject. Participating in a Challenge offers a critical exposure to this content. Students compete individually by answering multiple choice questions in a bee-style competition, starting with a regional challenge in their community. Students can advance to a State Challenge, and ultimately to the National Challenge. Anita Gaenko, a 4-H member and sixth grader from Clague Middle School, Ann Arbor won the regional championship. Anirudh Venkat, a 4-H member and sixth grader from Slauson Middle School, Ann Arbor got the third place. Tractor Supply 4-H Paper Clover campaign kicks off Oct. 3

Again this fall, local Tractor Supply Co. (TSC) stores are continuing their longstanding partnership with

4-H for the 2018 Fall Paper Clover Campaign supporting county, state and national 4-H programming.
