Washtenaw County 4-H is looking to build a Hippology (The Michigan 4-H Hippology Contest is on March 18, 2023) and Horse Judging (The Michigan 4-H/FFA Horse Judging Contest is April 16, 2023) team! Horse Hippology is the study of all horse-related knowledge, including judging, anatomy, breeds, colors, care, equipment, health and welfare, and riding disciplines. Horse Judging teaches what judges look for in conformation (halter) and performance (riding) classes. This is important information to know if you ever shop for a horse of your own.

Washtenaw County 4-H Junior Master Gardener Program: Starting May 8th at the Farm at Trinity Health Ann Arbor



We are excited to announce that our 4-H Junior Master Gardener Program is back this year at the Farm at Trinity Health Ann Arbor in Ypsilanti, MI. The 4-H Junior Master Gardener (JMG) program is designed for youth ages 9 to 11 and provides an interactive, hands-on educational experience in gardening enabling them to achieve a Junior Master Gardener certificate. Classes and workdays in the garden will take place on Monday evenings at the Farm. All sessions will be taught by adult volunteers who are both MSU Extension Master Gardeners and 4-H volunteers. This program is a great experience for youth interested in gardening to get a deep understanding of planting, tending, and harvesting plants in an almost one to one ratio of volunteers to youth.

The cost is \$50 for all the sessions but financial aid is available. Registration will launch soon and will be limited to 12 youth. If you are interested, please contact Jenny Speyer at speyerje@msu.edu and she will let you know as soon as the registration launches..



Register today for Michigan 4-H Capitol Experience!

At Michigan 4-H Capitol Experience, teens learn how to change the world for the better through engagement in Michigan's state government and public policy process. The 4-H Capitol Experience program, scheduled for March 12-14, in Lansing, has been described by past participants as "amazing", "life-changing", and "an opportunity unlike any other".



The three-day event, open to high-school-aged youth, includes tours of the Michigan Capitol, interactions with state legislators, meetings

with state agency staff, lobbyists and state-level experts and learning how policy is made. During the program, youth work in small teams to draft legislation on agriculture, civil rights, education, energy, environment and natural resources, health or law enforcement and corrections.

The cost to register in 2023 is \$365, which includes meals, material fees and lodging at the Radisson Hotel in downtown Lansing. Please contact your local 4-H program coordinator to inquire about local funding opportunities. Scholarships may also be available through your local Farm Bureau office.

World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute registrations due March 15!

As millions across the globe deal with food insecurity, the World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute (WFP MIYI) offers young people an opportunity to be part of the solution. Held May 11 in East Lansing, or by participating from anywhere else using Zoom video/web conference technology, the event seeks to inspire and prepare the next generation of global leaders to end world hunger.

Attendees will have the opportunity to share their ideas related to global food security with experts and other Michigan youth while learning how university faculty and staff members, researchers and students are working to address world hunger.

To participate, youth should be in grades 7-12 and register by the March 15 deadline. As part of the registration process, youth are required to prepare a two- to five-page research paper about a developing country and one of 20 key factors that affect food security. At the event, youth present and discuss their papers with other attendees and research and industry experts. They also participate in interactive activities related to global food challenges and engage with area experts to discuss solutions to global hunger and poverty.

The top performing students at the WFP MIYI will be selected to attend the World Food Prize Global Youth Institute in Des Moines, Iowa, in October. For more information, visit <u>https://www.canr.msu.edu/wfpmiyi/</u>. Registrations and papers are due March 15.
