Important Weigh In and Enrollment Dates for the Washtenaw County 4-H Youth Show



Remember that for youth to participate in the Washtenaw County 4-H Youth Show, **they must be enrolled in 4-H online by May 15th**. For youth planning to show beef, sheep, goats, feeders, or swine, the weigh in dates are the following:

- The weigh in dates for beef is March 4th, 2023
- The April date has changed to April 29th, 2023 for weigh in of sheep, goats, feeders and swine tagging

4-H Volunteer Selection Process: Child Abuse Reporting Protocol



The Child Abuse Reporting Protocol Training in Volunteer Central is now a required training and volunteers who have NOT completed it by December 31st, 2022, will automatically be marked as non-compliant and will not be able to volunteer with 4-H until the training is completed.
