Saline 4-H Farmer's Community Service Projects



The Saline 4-H Farmers Club has gone above and beyond these past two months in community service. Starting in November, youth from the club wrote letters to Santa to raise money for Make A Wish Foundation. Next, they brought in paper items to donate to Saline Area Social Service and helped with packing meals for local families for Coalition Against Hunger at a local church. Finally, the club youth brought livestock to put on a live nativity at a local church and made Christmas cards for local nursing home residents. We are proud of these club members and volunteers for going above and beyond in the service to their community!

What are Our 4-H Committees and What Do They Do?

As we have many families and members new to 4-H, we want to remind new and experienced 4-H'ers of the opportunities available at our 4-H Committee meetings.

In our county, we have the following committees that provide opportunities for youth and volunteers to have their voices heard and participate in leadership positions. We encourage all of our youth and leaders to attend one or more of these meetings. Meeting schedule for 2022-23 can be found here:

- The Horse Association focuses on horse and pony projects and is responsible for making many decisions related the horse and pony projects in the Youth Show. They also organize an annual tack sale.
- The Advisory Council supports our 4-H program by providing financial support through their annual Christmas tree sale to our college scholarships with Service Club, our annual 4-H recognition program, and many recruitment and outreach initiatives. The Advisory Council also helps with the award selection process for our scholarships and plans and coordinates recruitment events and campaigns. This small but mighty committee can use more volunteers and youth to help in their mission.
- The Livestock and Dairy Committee focuses on sheep, swine, beef cattle, and dairy cattle 4-H projects. The Livestock and
 Dairy Committee is responsible for making many decisions related to Livestock projects in the Youth Show. This includes
 Youth Show book changes, weigh-in, and planning for the Youth Show itself.
- Small Animal Committee is open to any youth, parents, or volunteers who are active or interested in goat, llama, poultry, rabbit, dog, cat, cavy, or pocket pet 4-H projects. This group also works very hard on planning for the small animal portions of the Youth Show, arranging small animal related workshops, and recruiting new 4-H members.
- Still Projects Committee is responsible for coordinating the Still Projects part of the Youth Show and for planning clinics and project days throughout the year to introduce youth to new project areas.
- Service Club runs the 4-H Kitchen during the Youth Show which provides funding for 4-H programs and scholarships. The Service Club would love to see more members join their group to help support Washtenaw County 4-H programs!

Horse Judging teaches what judges look for in conformation (halter) and performance (riding) classes. This is important information to know if you ever shop for a horse of your own. As we start to think ahead to the New Year, how can 4-H clubs resolve to improve in the year ahead? Here are ten suggestions to make the upcoming year a successful one.

Resolve that:

- 1. Club meetings will start and end on time.
- 2. Business meetings will follow Robert's Rules of Order and that all club paperwork, such as minutes, club inventory and financial statements, will be completed in a timely manner.
- 3. All members will take part in discussions and have a say in decisions that are made. Keep a chart with each members' name and when they speak at business meetings.
- 4. The club meeting place will be a safe, comfortable and welcoming environment for all club members.
- 5. Fun will be included in each meeting.
- 6. A learning activity will be included in each club meeting. Ideas include exploring a new 4-H curriculum, having members volunteer to do a demonstration, doing a show and tell about each members' favorite project, or bringing in a guest speaker.
- 7. The club will pursue at least one community service project chosen, planned and celebrated by the club.
- 8. New members will have a buddy they may talk with about any 4-H guestions.
- 9. The 4-H pledge will be said at every meeting.
- 10. Every club member will be recognized in some way to let them know they are cared about.
