JR Master Gardener

4-H Junior Master Gardener (JMG) is a program of Washtenaw 4-H Youth Development/Michigan State University Extension. JMG teaches youth 9-11 years old about gardening and volunteering via a series of classes. Participants will plant a garden and care for it through harvest. Classes provide a high-quality, positive learning experience via project-based, hands-on education. The program is based on the research and expertise of Michigan State University and Master Gardener volunteers. We hope to help kids discover that gardening is a fun and rewarding activity and volunteering is an important part of being a good citizen of the community.

Each JMG participant must attend all 6 classes, complete all quizzes, and accumulate at least 10 volunteer hours. Participants are responsible for caring for the JMG Garden, which they plant during the class, throughout the spring and summer until the Harvest Party. Participants who complete the JMG certification requirements above will be recognized and will receive a 4-H Junior Master Gardener certificate of accomplishment at the Harvest Party! The Master Gardener Volunteer instructors are screened MSU Extension 4-H volunteers and they would like to share their enthusiasm, expertise for gardening and volunteering with youth in our community. **Applications open – April 2022; Program begins – May 2022; Harvest Party – September 2022**
