Interested in Joining our Washtenaw County 4-H Hippology and/or Horse Judging Teams?

Washtenaw County 4-H is looking for registered 4-H members (ages 5-19) to join our Hippology Team and/or Horse Judging Team! Hippology is the study of all horse-related knowledge, including judging, anatomy, breeds, colors, care, equipment, tack, health and welfare, and riding disciplines. The Hippology event is Saturday, March 16th at MSU's Anthony Hall.



Horse Judging is your opportunity to become the judge and place horses based on conformation (halter) and performance (riding). The Horse Judging event is Saturday, April 13th at the MSU Pavilion. Both teams compete against other Michigan counties and senior divisions can qualify for the national contest. Cost is roughly \$23 per member, per team. Optional study sessions will start in early February. As we start the New Year, how can 4-H clubs resolve to improve in the year ahead? Here are ten suggestions to make the upcoming year a successful one.

Resolve that:

- 1. Club meetings will start and end on time.
- 2. Business meetings will follow Robert's Rules of Order and that all club paperwork, such as minutes, club inventory and financial statements, will be completed in a timely manner.
 - 3. All members will take part in discussions and have a say in decisions that are made. Keep a chart with each members' name and when they speak at business meetings.
 - 4. The club meeting place will be a safe, comfortable and welcoming environment for all club members.
 - 5. Fun will be included in each meeting.
 - 6. A learning activity will be included in each club meeting. Ideas include exploring a new 4-H curriculum, having members volunteer to do a demonstration, doing a show and tell about each members' favorite project, or bringing in a guest speaker.
 - 7. The club will pursue at least one community service project chosen, planned and celebrated by the club.
 - 8. New members will have a buddy they may talk with about any 4-H questions.
 - 9. The 4-H pledge will be said at every meeting.
 - 10. Every club member will be recognized in some way to let them know they are cared about.
