When you register, you are required to pay a \$50 deposit. 4-H staff will add your scholarship of \$50 after registration and then you can go back in to pay the balance before May 25th. Make sure not to pay more than \$170 total for youth and \$80 total for chaperones when you register.

Weigh In and Tagging on April 27th from 8-11 AM

Weigh in and tagging for feeders, market goats, sheep, and swine to be exhibited at the Washtenaw County 4-H Youth Show will be held on April 27th from 8 am – 11 am at the Washtenaw Farm Council Grounds. Questions? Contact Amy Harris.

Here are a few reminders about weigh-in/tagging rules:

- ALL cattle must have an RFID tag in their ear before they are transported. If you don't have the ability to tag the animal at home, please bring the RFID tag and tagger with you and we will get it in the ear at tagging.
- Animals MUST be tagged in at the spring weigh-in in order to be shown at the 4-H Youth Show.
- Exhibitors are allowed to tag in up to 4 animals, but can only exhibit 2 at the Youth Show
- All males must be castrated before tagging
- All sheep and goats must have a Scrapies tag or tattoo in order to exhibit at the 4-H Youth Show
- Exhibitors wishing to exhibit in the commercial lamb class must provide a receipt of purchase at weigh in that is within the current market range for feeder lambs for market.
- Lambs cannot exceed 110 pounds at the spring weigh-in
- All market hogs must be tagged at the spring weigh-in, but they will NOT be weighed. Hogs are not allowed to leave the trailer.

Swine Tagging Information for Washtenaw County 4-H Youth Show Participants

All Swine being shown at exhibitions, including fairs, jackpot shows and other events are required by state law to have an official ID in place. As the exhibitor you are responsible for having the correct ID.

The official ID types are as follows: 840 tags or Premise Identification Number or PIN tags.

To obtain official identification: Obtain a Premise Identification Number (PIN) of the farm premises where the pigs are housed. Call MDARD at 888-565-8626.

4-H Robotics is out of this world with the University of Michigan Mars Rover Team Leaders



On February 10th, Washtenaw County 4-H hosted a 4-H Robotics Workshop with the help of the University of Michigan Mars Rover Team Leaders for 27 youth in 3rd-8th grade. The Michigan Mars Rover Team (MRover) is a student-run, multidisciplinary organization whose mission is to design and build a rover for the exploration of extraterrestrial environments. This team strives to inspire and educate students about space, Mars exploration, and engineering, and focus on helping students grow as engineers.

This program was a huge success and many of the youth were asking how they could utilize robotics in the future from our 4-H office or enter them into our Washtenaw County 4-H Youth Show.

MRover Team Leaders Swaraj Kokatam, Lena Trang, and Prashant Saxena brought their passion and inspiration for engineering as they paired youth into 9 teams and led them thru an out of this world LEGO RoverBot mission during the workshop. The program they designed allowed the youth to build a robot, practice coding it to orbit around a photo of Mars on red tape, and also allowed the more advanced groups to work on speeding up their robot.

Not only was this event a success for the Washtenaw County 4-H Office, this was the MRover teams first K12 Outreach event ever. We hope to continue this partnership in the future and run more 4-H Robotics programs for youth in Washtenaw County.

Registration is open for 4-H Great Lakes and Natural Resource Camp!

4-H Great Lakes and Natural Resources Camp is an annual three-time national awardwinning camp that mixes summer fun and hands-on science education. The camp will be held July 28 - August 3 on the shores of Lake Esau at Camp Chickagami in Presque Isle. This pre-college program is for teens who will be age 13 to 15 during camp.

Campers will increase their science literacy and stewardship as they learn from natural resource experts in fields such as Great Lakes coastal and fisheries management, limnology, wildlife, forestry, geography, geology and environmental education. In addition to hands-on learning, attendees will also enjoy exciting natural resources recreation activities such as kayaking, snorkeling, sailing, fossil hunting, archery, photography and evenings around a campfire. First-time campers also go charter fishing and learn to fillet their catch.



Registration is now open! The registration fee is \$500 and includes six nights of lodging, all meals and snacks, a t-shirt and program and activity costs. Michigan 4-H youth who participate have the opportunity to stay in MSU campus residence halls while attending classroom and field trip sessions.
