The 2020 programming year proved to be a very challenging year because of the COVID-19 pandemic. We were forced to operate in a virtual format exclusively just three months into the calendar year. Like many organizations, the change was difficult for many of our clientele, especially our limited income families and our most vulnerable seniors.

Our staff worked hard to reach all populations that we normally served with Extension programming. The virus also delayed the opening of our Detroit Partnership for Food, Learning and Innovation Center, a new educational and research facility located in northwest Detroit. However, in spite of the challenges Extension provided a robust schedule of workshops and educational sessions that reached more than 50,000 residents in Wayne County.

As we transition back to more face-to-face programming we will as soon as it is viable, re-establish many of our old partnerships and collaborations that existed before the health crisis occurred. Our commitment to serve all groups regardless of location or economic status will not change as we strive to help improve the lives of Wayne county residents through an educational process that applies knowledge to critical issues, needs, and opportunities.

We would also like to thank the Wayne County Commission, Wayne County Executive, Warren Evans and our State Legislators for their continued financial support during such challenging times.

Program Area Summaries

- MSU Extension Nutrition and Physical Activity Education are means to prevent obesity and decrease chronic disease among adults. MSU Extension delivers high-quality and affordable education to serve the needs of children, youth, families and communities in urban, rural and suburban areas.
- MSU Extension Home Food Preservation classes teach participants how to preserve food by water-bath canning, pressure canning, freezing, or drying using researched based information and safe techniques.
- MSU Extension Natural Resources and Environmental Education Program uses vessel based education, fishing, archery, camping, nature exploration, water studies and other outdoor education programs to educate and to reconnect Michigan citizens, especially those living predominantly in urban areas, with the land.
- The MSU Extension Money Management and Financial Literacy programs are sessions that focused on helping consumers gain confidence and skills related to their personal finances. Participants attend these classes to understand their money values and how to communicate about money, create spending plans and SMART goals, manage debt, improve credit and create plans for saving and investing.
- MSU Extension Social-Emotional Health and Well-being programs strive to increase personal competencies, such as emotional resilience, self-esteem and interpersonal skills that help to protect against risks relating to exposure to toxic stress stemming from social and economic disadvantage, poor parenting, abuse, family disruption, relationship violence and other adversity in life. Our programs are targeted toward adults and children because across the lifespan, people faced with these situations and settings are at risk for a wide range of physical, psychological, social, emotional, cognitive, financial and spiritual health challenges.
- MSU Extension Early Childhood Education programming is designed to increase the knowledge of basic concepts of early child development including how to keep children socially, emotionally and physically safe as well as techniques that support school readiness and academic success for young children.
- MSU Extension 4-H programs allow youth participants to learn life skills that prepare them for the workforce especially for highly sought after jobs in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM). Extension programs help children develop early literacy skills that support school readiness. Participating youth learn leadership and decision-making skills in 4-H that will increase their likelihood of becoming civically active.

Program Area Summaries, continued

- MSU Extension Michigan Sea Grant facilitated or assisted with numerous projects in Wayne County including:
 - Aquatic Invasive Species Education centered on education and outreach programs at various locations throughout the county.
 - Safe & Sustainable Fisheries workshops that are intended to bring together anglers with fisheries managers and other subject matter experts to provide information about the status and trends of fishing in the Great Lakes and connecting waters.
 - Promoting Healthy Sustainable Communities work with 21 Downriver communities developing biking, hiking and paddling trails along the Downriver Linked Greenways (DLG)
- To become a certified MSU Extension Master Gardener, trainees attend a 14-week program to learn about research and evidence based horticultural practices. Trainees are responsible for completing 40 hours of educationally focused volunteer activity.
- ◆ The MSU Product Center Food-Ag-Bio assists Wayne County in developing products and businesses in the areas of food, agriculture, natural resources and the bio-economy. MSU Extension staff are trained as innovation counselors to deliver these services.
- MSU Extension Community Food Systems staff work to improve the local school food system by facilitating and supporting school gardens for improved agriculture literacy, increased exposure of students to more fresh vegetable food choices, and expanded experiential learning for the youth participants.
- MSU Extension Government and Public Policy staff focuses on developing capacity for communities
 to position themselves for success in the 21st Century Michigan through partnerships between MSUE,
 county and local governments, and community leaders in Wayne county in the areas of land use
 planning, zoning, strategic planning, place-making, historic preservation,

and fiscal sustainability.

The MSU Detroit Partnership for Food, Learning and Innovation broke ground during the first half of 2018 at the site of the former Houghton Elementary School in the Riverdale neighborhood, near Brightmoor. Urban-focused research areas for the center include soil sampling and pollution cleanup, pest and crop disease management, forestry, innovative growing systems and community food systems development.

Michigan State University Extension-District 11 Wayne County had a challenging programming year for 2020. The COVID-19 Pandemic forced all programming to a virtual platform starting in March of that programming year. The result was an uneven programming year where we saw significant declines in participation for 4-H youth development and volunteer participation. While those areas saw significant decreases, we saw a general increase in all of the other programming categories. The most significant increase was seen in the area of health, nutrition and wellness. Participation of Wayne county residents was reported from our state Extension office and included all programs offered across the State of Michigan.

We anticipate some face-to-face programming for the 2021 year but those activities will not occur until late summer or fall, hopefully. The majority of our efforts will continue to remain virtual until we are given the opportunity to fully engage face-to-face programming.

Program Spotlight

Nutrition Education Program (2020)

Wayne County received a Cooking Matters grant partnership with Communities in Schools (CIS) of Michigan, that stretches across the state. It's a very innovate project, where CIS provides food ingredients to our instructors through Instacart delivery service, to allow for virtual live food demonstrations.

A group of middle schoolers participated in a 6-week Cooking Matters for Teens class at Salina Intermediate School in Wayne County. The youth learned how to make healthy recipes over the course of the weeks and loved the class so much, that they decided to make a PowerPoint highlighting lessons learned and showcasing pictures of their homemade recipes!

4-H Money Management Education Program (2020)

A money management GooseChase virtual scavenger hunt game was created for Great Money Games Challenge 4-H SPIN Club participants and two sisters won. Their parent provided feedback: "Kyra and Kaia are looking forward to [getting their piggy bank prize]! They both really enjoyed the missions and learned a lot from the group - started some good family discussions!"



Community Sustainability (2020)



The Detroit Partnership for Food Learning and Innovation along-side the Product Center and MSU Tollgate Farms, conducted a Race, Food, and Land in Detroit Lecture Series. They brought in guest speakers and had 150 attendees at each of the 3 virtual lectures. Additionally, the Product Center held webinars in Spanish on How to Launch a Food Business in Michigan and had 23 self-identifying Hispanic attendees of which 20 were women and 3 were men.

Mamba Hamissi not only launched an East African Cuisine Restaurant in the Heart of Midtown Detroit but also launched his passion-fruit juice, Ji which we were instrumental to in getting his concept ready for market.
