This contest is open to Michigan 4-H youth. Those not currently registered for 4-H can do so prior to entering this contest. The deadline for registration and video submissions is January 31, 2024.

A total of six prizes will be awarded to the top videos judged by professionals. There will be two age brackets for this competition:

- 4-H ages 9-13 (as of January 1, 2024)
- 4-H ages 14-19 (as of January 1, 2024)

Each age bracket will have three winners, who will receive the following prizes:

- First place prize: \$100 Amazon gift card
- Second place prize: \$75 Amazon gift card
- Third place prize: \$50 Amazon gift card

Wayne County 4-H'er Spotlight

 Meet Evelyn! A longtime 4-H'er in the community, Evelyn has much to boast about: from travelling nationally to compete with other equestrians, to being crowned Fair Princess, this Wayne County 4-H'er has certainly made her mark. Read her first-hand account of her experiences and future plans here!



Hello!

My name is Evelyn, I am 14 and a member of American Youth 4-H club in Wayne County. I have been a member since I was 5 years old and have shown horses every year since. My mom was a member of American Youth (AY) growing up, and the friends she made have become family. It was only natural that my siblings, Annabelle (11) and Woodson (7), and I would also be in AY!

I've always loved horses. 4-H offered me an opportunity to learn about the animal and showing, along with the responsibility of horse ownership through the protege program where I was paired with and mentored by an older club member. My love of horses only grew, and I ended up getting my own horse, Bubbles. Bubbles and I have competed in 4-H and other shows, including qualifying and attending the Western Dressage World Show in Oklahoma in 2022. This year my sister showed Bubbles and an AY alumni allowed me to lease her horse, Abby, to show. We really had a great year together!

This year I competed in the Wayne County's fair royalty program and won Wayne County Princess. Fair is always my favorite week of the year, and being able to have such a big role throughout the week and meet so many people this year made it even better! Following fair, I had the honor of representing our county at the 4-H Michigan Horse State Show with the horse I showed, Abby. Meeting and seeing other equestrians my age from across the state and showing together was really fun. I hope to get to go again.

My favorite 4-H memories are definitely late nights at fair with my club hanging out, doing scavenger hunts, watching my friends show their animals and getting together through the year to watch each other in other activities and shop for the family our club adopts every Christmas.

I plan to continue in 4-H at least through high school. In the future, I hope to be a collegiate equestrian while going to school to pursue law and or politics.

When asked to share her greatest reward as a 4-H volunteer leader, LaForest replied, "It'd be difficult to say but I could narrow it down to two things. The first being that I feel being a 4-H Leader has given me a way to feel that I can 'return the favor' to 4-H. I've always felt indebted to 4-H because it led me into my career as a Horse Trainer, Farm Owner & Riding Instructor. Secondly, 4-H has given me unlimited opportunity to share my love of horses with so many youth. It has always been important to me that future generations understand, love & care for horses the way I have my entire life."

LaForest is a long-time 4-H volunteer with a focus on horse showmanship and equestrianism. She has worked on advancing youth skills in many areas, including the protégé program, horse clinics, project RED, and coaching middle and high school equestrian teams. She is passionate about imparting knowledge onto youth interested in agricultural careers at an early age and stresses the importance of making safe choices and caring for their animals- the youth she educates are expected to learn how to properly handle, groom, and train their horses.

LaForest's leadership extends beyond youth equestrian education: she is a chairperson for Equine, was on the Fair Board, is the president of Wayne County Horse & Pony, and as president, created the Junior Board to educate youth on the parliamentary procedures of Fair Board for the future.

Recently, LaForest has headed up the Master Equestrian program for Wayne County. This program offers youth the opportunity to compete for the title of Master Equestrian, while expanding their knowledge of showmanship and equestrianism.

We are so happy to have such a passionate, knowledgeable, and caring individual be apart of the Wayne County 4-H family. We are excited to see where her future takes her and the youth she works with!
