



# **Wayne County Success Story**

### Cadillac Urban Gardens STEM Pathways 4-H SPIN Club

Cadillac Urban Gardens is a 1-acre urban garden located in southwest Detroit that provides fresh produce and education to local Detroiters. Cadillac Urban Gardens' mission is to create equitable access to culturally relevant foods by fostering multigenerational knowledge and leadership in Detroit.

MSU Extension Wayne County 4-H developed a partnership with Cadillac Urban Gardens at the beginning of 2024. The goal was to provide youth with educational opportunities to explore agricultural and STEM-related careers while exposing youth to life skills through hands-on learning. In the summer of 2024, the Wayne County 4-H staff led a 6-week STEM Pathways 4-H SPIN Club that met bi-weekly June-August. During this club, the youth were able to participate in a variety of hands-on activities that explored various careers in STEM and agriculture as well as taught valuable life skills. Youth explored a variety of career pathways including, but not limited to, Agronomist, Agriculture Engineer, Finance Officer, Environmental Engineer, Geologist, Geophysicists, Polymer Scientist, Electrical Mechanical Technician, and Quality Manager. Additionally, youth learned how to work as a team, solve problems, think critically, goal setting, financial planning, and more!

Each week youth were presented with a problem and then it was up to them to find a solution and experiment with the materials given. For example, during the Ag Bot Harvest Challenge, youth were challenged to engineer a device that harvests the most grain in the least time, the problem being due to the rapid growth of the world's population, farmers will need to figure out a way to grow and harvest crops more efficiently and in shorter periods to meet the demand. Using basic supplies such as tape, popsicle sticks, cups, etc. Youth were able to use the process of engineering to design, test, and re-design a prototype to solve this problem. Once the youth completed the activity, we then discussed the different career pathways and the job outlooks for careers related to that specific activity.

Overall, the club served on average 10 youth a week with a total of 12 enrollments. One of our high school members claimed, "The material and activities were interesting. I liked learning about the different careers, and the activities are hands-on and super fun. It's not like anything I have learned in school." Additionally, we were able to successfully onboard one new Gold Level Volunteer who is interested in continuing 4-H programming at the gardens next year and hoping to connect more Junior MANRRS related items to the programming. While this SPIN club was a pilot program, we are interested to see how this partnership with Cadillac Urban Gardens and Wayne County 4-H will evolve as we look for ways to expand our outreach throughout Detroit and all of Wayne County.

### Wild Spartans series is back!

The ever pooular 4-H Wild Spartans series is back for a new season! Join 4-H staff as they meet scientists from across MSU Extension, the MSU Department of Fisheries and Wildlife, the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, and more!

Follow along as we climb through bogs, peer into bear dens, mist net songbirds, snorkel for fish, or perhaps even tag deer. Meet researchers, learn about their field work, and the education and career path they've followed to get there. Sessions last approximately 30 minutes and will feature 1-2 guest researchers. Following presentations, youth will be encouraged to ask questions to learn more through a live Q&A with scientists.

Suggested audience age is 12-19 years. Viewers are encouraged to watch together with their families. This free series is open to both 4-H members and non-4-H members. Monthly sessions will be held on the second Tuesday of the month at 6:30 p.m. ET, October through March.

4-H Future Squad was inspired by Generation Z youth seeking life skill development for a better future for themselves and their peers. This will be the fourth year of the program, which is designed to help youth feel prepared and ready to take on the future and adulthood.
