What are your recent/past 4-H achievements?

I have been successfully conducting a STEM club for the past 3 years. I invite expert speakers to each session. They discuss their expertise with the students who then ask them questions. A new STEM topic is discussed each week. The speakers have been very gracious with their time and the learning has been greatly enriching for the students.

Being an avid reader, I like sharing my joy of reading with others. I recently donated more than 5000 books to the Children's Hospital of Michigan.

Finally, I am passionate about spreading education on the importance of yoga and mindfulness in schools. To this effect, I published an opinion piece in the guest commentary section Bridge magazine recently (<u>https://www.bridgemi.com/guest-commentary/opinion-michigan-student-says-pe-mindfulness-critical-mental-health</u>).

How and when did you get involved with 4-H?

I was 5 years old when I first learned about the meaning of volunteerism. My mom took me to an event in Detroit where students were encouraged to read through little free libraries (LFL). I was awarded my very own LFL which I have shared with my friends and neighbors to date. Since then, I was hooked to the cause of serving others. I became a 4-H member and started raising books for underserved kids in Detroit and in India. I then travelled to India and visited several rural schools to help open more than 7 little free libraries in their communities. On my return from India, our communities were torn down by the pandemic. Schools were closed and students felt lost. I decided to bring our youth together by starting a virtual STEM club. This club has invited more than 60 speakers and I have spent more than 400 volunteer hours organizing and conducting the club which runs every week.

What drew you to being a part of the 4-H program?

I belong to a family of immigrants who were raised in India. My mom had limited resources growing up, but she was very active in volunteering. She has been working in Detroit for the past 17 years and has always participated in volunteer service. Her spirit is certainly very infectious and that is how I got exposed to volunteerism. I always enjoyed the experience of serving others and now it is part of my life.

What have you gained from being a part of 4-H?

4-H has empowered me to become a leader who is kind and compassionate. I feel more confident as a person. As I have conducted 4-H clubs and introduced various speakers, I have improved my communication skills. I believe 4-H has been very instrumental in developing my personality.

What advice would you give someone else in 4-H or thinking about joining 4-H?

I would tell them to trust the system and enjoy the journey. You never know when you will meet someone who may be your mentor for life. Also, 4-H helps you develop your leadership and communication skills which can shape your personality in big ways.

What is your favorite memory of 4-H?

I enjoy all the activities conducted by 4-H. One time, I was asked to share the importance of an Indian holiday called Diwali that I celebrate each year with my family. This was one of the best experiences I had since the students loved learning about Diwali.

What are your plans for the future?

As a 4-H member, I would like to continue serving my community and growing as a person. I want to focus on United Nations goals 4 and 10 which focus on quality and equitable education for all. I am also very passionate about raising awareness on plant-based diet and yoga. I would like to pursue a STEM field when I am older.

Is there anything else you want to share about yourself or 4-H that we may include?

I hope more students can join 4-H and help the world through amazing programs offered by 4-H.

Fun at the DIA!





As a part of 4-H Day of Wellness, Wayne County 4-H partnered with the Detroit Institute of Arts. Although the group spent just two hours together, it was packed with fun and learning!

Our time together was split into two parts: a guided social and emotional learning (SEL) tour, and mindful art creation. The DIA staff led our group on a mini SEL tour through the museum, where we got to take in the sights and the art. We stopped at a few pieces of art, and we discussed what the artists may have been feeling when creating, and we even got to make our own mini creations in the gallery! Our tour guide was knowledgeable, kind, and showed us the importance of connecting with art.

Back in our hands-on space (where we could touch the art!), the group created two projects: a calming jar, and a painting. The calming jar was a huge success, and the youth loved mixing colors and glitter to create their own personalized jar. The jar is meant to be used as a way to re-center when experiencing big emotions. If one is feeling anxious, upset, angry, or overwhelmed, they can give the jar a shake to focus their attention elsewhere or sit more quietly with their thoughts. Not only did the group have fun creating, they also learned a valuable mechanism for coping.

They also created a painting. While I gave them supplies to create a mixed media piece using multiple materials, the group almost unanimously gravitated towards the paint! They loved the experience of creating using paint, and seeing their painting come together. Some participants chose to paint something they loved, while others chose a more abstract route. Not only did the youth get to leave with a piece of artwork, we learned that paint was a popular technique!

Register today for Michigan 4-H Capitol Experience!

At Michigan 4-H Capitol Experience, teens learn how to change the world for the better through engagement in Michigan's state government and public policy process. The program is scheduled for March 17-19, in Lansing. The three-day event, open to high school-aged youth, includes tours of the Michigan Capitol, interactions with state legislators, meetings with state agency staff, lobbyists and state-level experts, and learning how policy is made. During the program, youth work in small teams to draft legislation on agriculture, civil rights and youth advocacy, crime and law enforcement, education and teacher retention, environment and natural resources, health, or jobs and the economy/infrastructure.

The cost to register in 2024 is \$365, which includes meals and lodging at the Quality Inn University in Lansing. As millions across the globe deal with food insecurity, the World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute (WFP MIYI) offers young people an opportunity to be part of the solution. Held May 9 in East Lansing, or by participating from anywhere else using Zoom video/web conference technology, the event seeks to inspire and prepare the next generation of global leaders to end world hunger.

To participate, youth should be in grades 7-12 and register by the March 15 deadline. As part of the registration process, youth are required to prepare and submit a 2-to-5-page research paper about a developing country and one of 20 key factors that affect food security. At the event, youth present and discuss their papers with other attendees and research and industry experts. The top performing students at the WFP MIYI will be

selected to attend the World Food Prize Global Youth Institute in Des Moines, Iowa, in October.



Apply for a Michigan 4-H State Award!

Michigan 4-H true leaders ages 11 and older have an opportunity to be recognized for the great work they do in 4-H and develop their career skills by completing a state award application. A Michigan 4-H State Award is the highest honor bestowed on a Michigan 4-H member and provides an opportunity to receive recognition for their engagement in rich learning experiences that result in outstanding knowledge and life-skill development.

State award applications are divided into four categories: Mark of Excellence essay contest (11-12 years), junior state award (13-15 years), senior state

award (16-19 years) and group awards (13-19 years). Each application and selection process varies, dependent on the age of the 4-H member. Additional details about the Michigan 4-H State Award process can be found at http://bit.ly/stateaward.
