4-H Tractor Safety Program

For 14 and 15 Year Old Youth

Teens can improve their chances of employment this summer by completing a tractor safety training course!

Successful completion of a tractor operation safety course is required for all youth under the age of 16 who perform farm jobs classified as hazardous, under the U.S. Department of Labor's Hazardous Occupation Order.

To become certified, participants must attend <u>all five</u> course sessions, pass a written test and a tractor driving test. Who: MSU Extension will host this training for 14 & 15
Year Old Youth. Youth must be age 14 by June 1st, 2019.
Space is limited! (16—19 Year olds are encouraged to
participate, but priority is given to 14-15 year olds). Class
curriculum follows the National Safe Tractor and
Operational Machinery Program.
