

Research Paper Summary Worksheet for Roundtable Discussions



This worksheet is an **optional** tool students can use to prepare what they will say during the Roundtable Discussion portion of the event. Each student is **required** to provide an overview of their research paper during the Roundtable Discussions. Each student will have up to 5 minutes to provide their overview, and then they will answer a few questions that others have about their research and recommendations. Students can use this worksheet to write some notes to help them remember what they want to share about their research and recommendations in the Roundtable Discussion.

Introduction (short - about 15 seconds)

(Share your name, where you are from, the name of the country you researched, and the global challenge topic you selected for your paper)

Describe your chosen country and a typical family in that country (about 1 minute)

(Share some important facts about the country you researched and share what life is like for typical family in the country. Include some information about how food insecurity impacts people in your country)

Describe the global challenge topic you selected and the impact of that topic on the country you chose to study (about 1.5 minutes)

(Describe how the global challenge topic you selected impacts the country you researched. Try to include some information from your research paper about how the global challenge topic you selected impacts food security in the country as well.)

Share the potential solutions and recommendation you made to address the challenge (about 2 minutes)

(Describe the 2-3 solutions you considered to address the global challenge topic in the country you researched. Describe the solution you would recommend to address the global challenge topic and why you think that is the best option. Describe the strengths and limitations of the solution you are recommending, how it could be implemented, and what impact you hope it would achieve)

Conclusion (about 15 seconds)

(Briefly summarize the key points of your research and recommendations and thank the other participants for listening to your overview)
