


Realistic Western Bean Cutworm Moth Identification

(after it's been beat up and soaked in antifreeze)









- ✓ WBC A "good" specimen.
 The main ID characteristics are clearly visible:
- Whitish stripe at the front margin of each forewing.

 Even in bad specimens, the stripe, though faint, will be there.
- Two white markings a kidney bean/ **comma** and a small **circle**, on each forewing.

✓ WBC

A more typical specimen. Scales missing, less colorful.

You can still see part of one comma, both of the circles, and the stripes.

✓ WBC

Circles are present Comma faint, but still present.

The stripes, even though subtle, are still visible at front of wing

-- NOT WBC

Forewing lacks the white bar and other identification marks.
