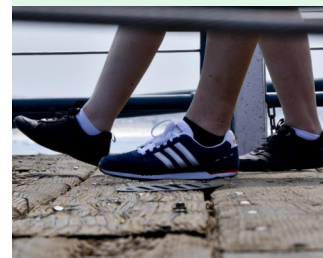

1. If the Member OR the dog have experience or training outside of 4H by a 4H leader, they must enter in the B class where provided. Member/dog team may be in each performance class level two years (A/B or B/B)
2. On Leash = dog attached to 6 ft lead that is held at all times by the member unless exercise requires otherwise
3. Off Leash = while dog enters and exits the ring on a standard 6 ft lead, the lead is not attached during required off leash exercises/an off leash class (Rally, Agility).
4. Each individual dog may only be entered in One of each Performance classes (Obedience, Rally, Agility). It can do different showmanship classes if used by member of same family
5. AKC jump heights will be utilized in all exercises requiring jumps. Exception – Beginner Standard & JWW and special needs dogs will jump half AKC height
6. Treats/Bait – with the exception of Showmanship and trick class, at NO TIME will treats/bait or toys be allowed in any ring for any class.
7. Member may enter one class from each Performance Class but may enter as many Miscellaneous Classes desired. Except if entered in a performance class may not enter Pet Dog.

_____ Advanced B	
_____ Excellent A	Both A & B Same course - Two jumps (bar, high or broad) , 12-15 signs/stations from the AKC Novice, Advanced and Excellent level Cannot touch dog even for a stand. No patting leg or clapping.
_____ Excellent B

On Leash

- _____ **Beginner Novice** - Standard Agility course- On leash, with dog walk, jumps (bar, high broad), table, tunnel, And chute. No A Frame. No teeter, No Weaves. (Jumps at ½ AKC height for each dog)
- _____ **Beginner Jumpers With Weaves** – no contact equipment. Jumps (bar high broad), Tunnel, table, 6 weaves (jumps at half height for each dog)

Off leash

- _____ **Novice Standard** - Off leash Standard Course - 6 weaves, dog walk, A Frame, teeter, jumps (bar, high, broad), table, tunnel, and chute. (Jumps at full AKC height)
- _____ **Advanced Standard** - Off leash Standard course – 12 weaves, single Jumps (bar, High, Broad), Double Jumps, A Frame, Teeter, Dog Walk, Table, Tunnel, and Chute. Jumps at full AKC height.
- _____ **Advanced Jumpers with Weaves** - No Contact equipment. Includes jumps (bar, high, double), 12 weaves, tire, chute, tunnel, table and double jump)

Miscellaneous Classes – all on leash

- _____ **Pet Dog** - **Dogs entered in this class may NOT be entered in any performance classes.** This class is designed for those dogs who cannot or will not do performance events. Allows member to participate with their dog anyway. Member demonstrates a quality bond with the pet dog and knowledge of the project through interview judging that may include short display of tricks and other skills taught to the dog.
- _____ **Trick Dog** Member has 1 minute to show all the tricks the dog knows. Dogs may be off leash to perform tricks. This class can be used to earn an AKC trick Title! Must inform judge if member wishes to be evaluated for this title prior to performing any tricks. (<https://www.akc.org/sports/trick-dog>)
- _____ **Costume** No division by age. Member may or may not be in co-ordinating costume. Entry is evaluated on degree of difficulty, originality, quality, creativity
- _____ **Fun Ring** Not divided by age. Fun course combining rally obedience and agility skills, with some fun twists. No agility/rally experience needed

Members must be officially in a service or guide dog puppy raising program. Approval by Superintendent required Member demonstrations social and training skills under a variety of distractions as would be found in the life of a Service Dog
