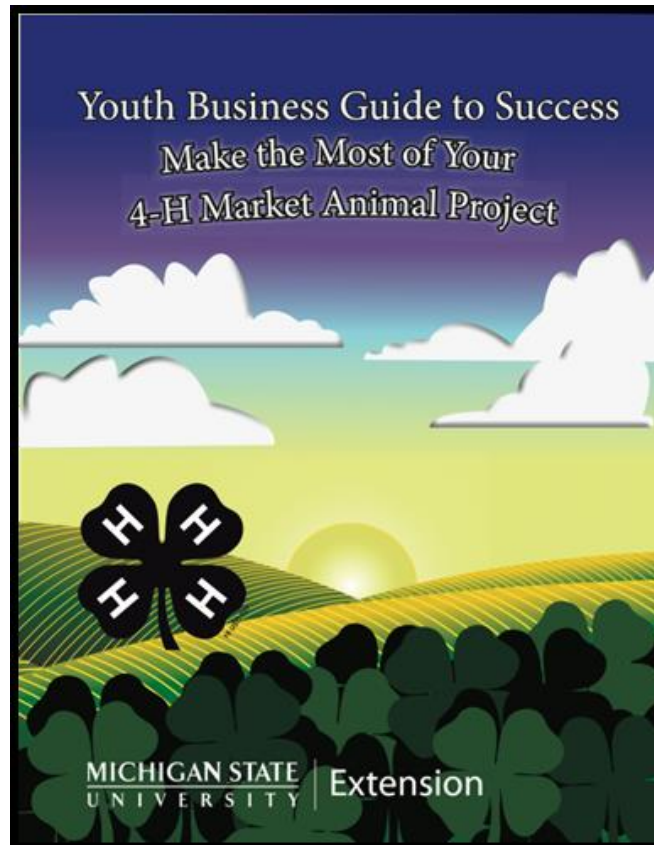

The British Whites are known for their lean meat and docile disposition.

The breed is also polled, which means it doesn't have horns.

The British White is a very cool looking cow being mostly white with black (or rarely, red) points; ears, eyes, hoofs and switch (tail hair).

There are over 2,500 registered British White cattle.

The British White average weight is between 1000-1500 pounds.

Danny is a British White. I bought him from Bauman Farm in Leslie.



The British White breed originated in England. It was imported to the United States in 1941. The British White breed society was formed in 1975.

The breed is gaining popularity on American farms for its exceptional attributes. These include not only the lean meat and docile disposition, but also its hardiness, rangeability and decent milk yield.

British Whites are a stocky and short breed. The bulls are 4 1/2 feet tall and the cows are 4 feet.
