Comprehensive growers guide, down to earth, how-to-do format. Every blueberry grower should have a copy of this book. Focused on Northern highbush production typical of Michigan and New York.

Blueberries (Crop Production Science in Horticulture) by J.B. Retamales and J.F Hancock. 2012. (T) CABI, Cambridge MA 021139. An excellent resource, focused on growers and consultants. Most recent update on blueberry science and culture. Authored by two authorities in the field.

Blueberries for Growers, Gardeners, Promoters edited by N. F. Childers and P.M. Lyrene. 2005. (B) order from Norman F. Childers Publications, 3906 NW 31st Place, Gainesville, FL 32606. 266 pages \$50. An excellent resource, easy to understand, lots of pictures. Each chapter is authored by an authority in the field. Focus is more on southern highbush production where most of the recent expansion has occurred.

The Highbush Blueberry and Its Management by R. E. Gough. 1994. (B) Food Products Press, Binghamton NY. 277 pages. An excellent resource, easy to understand. More complete than Childers & Lyrene because it was written by a single author. More focused on northern highbush.

Blueberries (Crop Production Science in Horticulture) by J.B. Retamales and J.F Hancock. 2012. (T) CABI, Cambridge MA 021139. An excellent resource, focused on growers and consultants. Most recent update on blueberry science and culture. Authored by two authorities in the field.

Somewhat academic treatment of the subject. Book is more collection of research papers. A companion volume to Blueberry Culture.
