

ABOUT THE SURVEY

The Barriers to Infrastructure survey was developed by members of the Farmers Policy Action Team of the Washtenaw County Food Policy Council (WFPC) and distributed to local farmers using the socialfarmers listserv, the Washtenaw County Farmers Facebook group, and the MSU Extension Local Food Coordinator's email list. The survey was open from May to August 2021. Sixteen responses were submitted.



GREATEST INFRASTRUCTURE CHALLENGES



LACK OF CONTRACTORS AND BUILDERS

"A major challenge has been finding builders appropriate for farm-based infrastructure. Ann Arbor has a lot of "home remodel" type builders, but few who are willing or interested to work on farm infrastructure."

"There is a lack of experienced farm consultants available for advice, design, and installation of infrastructure. "



TIME

"The biggest challenge is actually time. Most farms are busy making farm operations work so there is typically not enough time to work on infrastructure. Every new improvement takes knowledge gathering, resource finding, and a whole bunch of time."



ACCESS TO FINANCING

"Loan applications are overwhelming, time consuming, and terms can be quite short (7 years)."
